Entering PreK through Entering 5th Grade

Kids entering PreK (formerly 3 year olds – see other option for them below) through entering 5th graders (formerly 4th graders) will start out with their parents in the worship service, at 9:00 a.m. in the Garden or 9:15 a.m. in the Sanctuary. Good News If You Are Over The Age Of 70-1/2 and Have An IRA

2011 tax law allows you to make a present donation of up to \$100,000 from your IRA to your church and/or other charities. The amount of this IRA distribution is not included in your taxable income and will not subject your Social Security income to higher tax levels, but will count toward your IRA required minimum distribution. Your qualified charitable distributions are federal-income-tax-free, but you get no itemized charitable deduction on your tax return. But that's okay. The tax-free treatment of these qualified charitable distributions equates to a 100 percent deduction, since the otherwise-taxable IRA dollars are sent directly to charity. The donation check must come directly from your IRA administrator. Don't make the mistake of receiving a distribution from your IRA and then writing your own check to your church or other charity. **This information is provided for general educational purposes only. Please consult with your tax advisor. Resurrection House

Nobody wants to be homeless, yet there are many men and women right here in Sarasota who are just that. On average, a total of more than 200 individuals each day visit Resurrection House. RH is this city's only daytime, faith-based resource center for our homeless population. They receive a caring and valuable assist in what we commonly call "basic" needs: a shower, free laundry service, counseling and job search help, in-house medicare care, a haircut, etc. When you drop off your donations in a bag or container marked "RH" in the Administration Building, you are helping individuals who are very much in need. As usual, they always say "thank you." Some current summer-time needs are: rain gear, all kinds of batteries, backpacks, bug spray/wipes, toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorants, sunblocks, white crew socks, jeans, shorts, t-shirts. "Replacing Homelessness with Hopefulness."

Cedarkirk Trip – Middle School Made A Difference

The middle school mission team gave a weeklong breath of fresh air to farmworkers and learned what a gift giving can be to the giver. Twenty-nine middle schoolers and five adult leaders attended the Cedarkirk Challenge to Change Mission trip June 12 - 17. These kids went out each morning to do manual labor to improve the living conditions of farmworkers in the Wimauma area. The students split up into three worksites, two private homes (broken down trailers) and the Beth-El ministry site. Two groups removed old flooring, countertops, bathroom fixtures, and rotting wood and replaced/rebuilt these with new materials. While at the work sites, these students played with children and brightened the days of disabled and elderly adults. One group cleaned and repainted an 800 foot long fence at Beth-El. Most importantly, the mission workers made connections with real people who are less fortunate than they are, and got to experience the joy of knowing them and serving them. They learned what real poverty is, that it is not having your basic needs met, and got to see first-hand what that looks and feels like.
