Entering PreK through Entering 5th Grade

Kids entering PreK (formerly 3 year olds – see other option for them below) through entering 5th graders (formerly 4th graders) will start out with their parents in the worship service, at 9:00 a.m. in the Garden or 9:15 a.m. in the Sanctuary.
